4. Only one entry per class allowed
5. Entries to be forwarded to the Show Secretary on completed entry forms by noon on Friday the 20<sup>th</sup> August 2010.
6. **No entries allowed on the day**
7. Entries to be staged between 9.00am and 11.30 am on the day of the show
8. Judging to commence at 11.30 am
9. Prizegiving at 2.00 pm
10. Prizes from the Show Secretary on production of prize card after prizegiving
11. Entrants should collect any exhibit they want returned by 4.00pm. Any exhibit left after then will be sold or donated to charity.
